ABOUT nwsa

New World School of the Arts was created by the Florida Legislature as a center of excellence in the visual and performing arts. Mandated to service specific artistic and academic needs of talented, professionally minded young artists in South Florida, today New World School of the Arts' accomplishments contribute significantly to the growing reputation of South Florida as a vibrant center of cultural activity.

NWSA operates through an educational partnership between Miami-Dade County Public Schools, Miami Dade College and the University of Florida. In addition to dual enrollment college opportunities for high school students, NWSA also allows each college graduate to earn an AA degree from Miami Dade College, and a BFA or BM from University of Florida. In addition to academic accreditation, each arts division is nationally accredited correspondingly by the National Associations of Schools of Dance, Music, Theater, and Art & Design.

Its outstanding teaching faculty of professional artists, talented students, staff, and network of supporters are at the core of NWSA's recognition as a world-class institution of learning in Dance, Music, Theatre, and Visual Arts.

New World School of the Arts was created by the Florida Legislature as a center of excellence in the performing and visual arts. It is an educational partnership of Miami-Dade County Public Schools, Miami Dade College and the University of Florida.

Donors have the opportunity to designate their scholarship donation to benefit any of the specific arts division at New World School of the Arts: Dance, Music, Theatre, Visual Arts.

In order to be considered for scholarships, NWSA students must meet set academic and artistic standards. Students are evaluated by their Dean, in collaboration with the division faculty, for scholarship consideration.

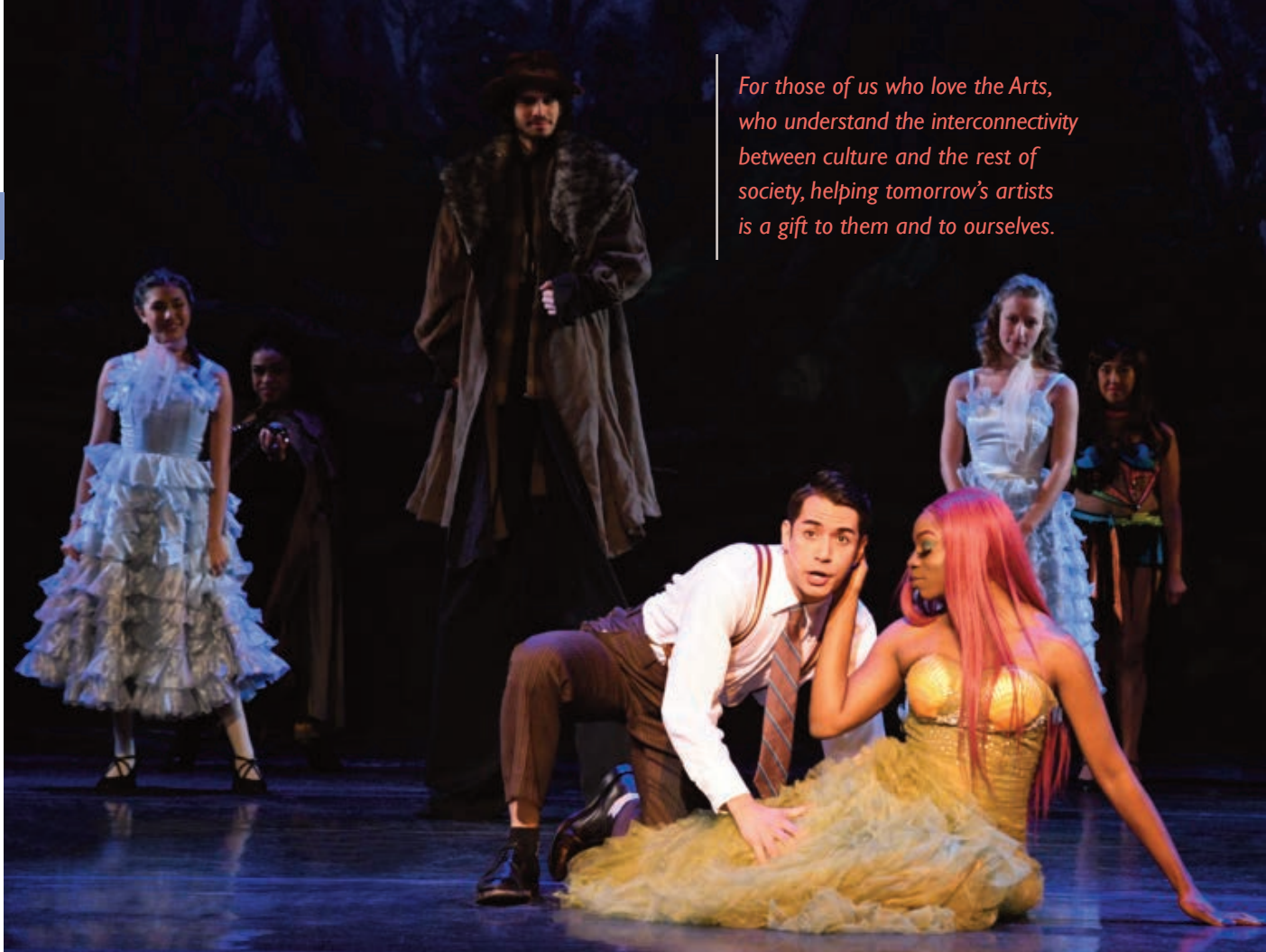
By law, donors are not permitted to participate in the selection process. Your wishes are fulfilled through the establishment of the scholarship criteria at the time you make your gift. Scholarships may not be restricted by race, national origin, or gender.



ENDOWED scholarship

An endowed scholarship is invested in perpetuity, with a portion of the annual earnings being used for scholarships. The minimum for establishing an endowed named scholarship fund is \$25,000.

The funds are combined with those of other donors for investment purposes. The investments are overseen by the Miami Dade College Foundation's Investment Committee and professionally managed by a nationally recognized investment advisory company.

NON-ENDOWED scholarship

A non-endowed scholarship does not earn interest and does not exist in perpetuity unless additional donations are received. Funds will be awarded to students until the account is depleted. The minimum for establishing a non-endowed named scholarship fund is \$5,000.
